

Another School Year Begins!

It's amazing, but this Tuesday will be the first day of school. As pastor of the Church of the Resurrection, I am excited about what God has in store for our parish, school, and community this year. Jacob Allstott, Chris Gates, and the wonderful team of teachers and staff members who make our Catholic school possible have been busily at work to prepare for another year of providing families an excellent Catholic school education here at Resurrection School. Please keep the faculty, staff, students, and families in prayer as we begin our new school year. Come, Holy Spirit!

Realigning Resources for Mission

As I wrote a few months ago, the priests of the diocese gathered with Bishop Boyea and members of the Realigning Resources for Mission (RRM) Committee to discuss proposed groupings of parishes, which the committee believes would help us all (throughout the entire diocese) more effectively form missionary disciples, to fulfill the Great Commission, and the bishop's vision for a healthy parish, which has been characterized as follows:

A healthy parish in the Diocese of Lansing:

- is led by priests striving for health and holiness
- equips and empowers parish staff
- makes and forms missionary disciples and seeks the lost and serves the poor.

Subsequent Steps

After the June meeting with priests, the RRM Committee and Chancery Staff met with staff members of parishes and the deacons, to get more feedback on the proposed parish groupings. The reason for proposing "groupings of parishes" is to find better ways to ensure that every Catholic in the diocese is part of a parish that is able to and committed to the vision outlined above. Please note that in these parish groupings, no parishes are proposed to be closed, but nearly all parishes will be "grouped" with others. The details of how these groups will be structured and governed remain to be determined, but, as I mentioned in June, we will learn a lot from the process of implementation, which will be ongoing. We will take seriously into account the lessons of "early adopters" across the diocese. Those early adopters could begin working together in new structures as early as a year from now. My hope and prayer is that all of us—priests, staff, and lay faithful—will be open to this move of the Holy Spirit in our midst. Indeed, let us all keep praying, "Come, Holy Spirit!" We will have many opportunities to talk more about this, and I invite you to sign up for the weekly emails from the diocese, which include updates on the RRM process.

August 29 RRM Meetings

Next Sunday evening, beginning at 6:30 p.m. all interested members of the diocese are invited to join

simultaneous meetings at the four diocesan high schools to share with the people of God the proposals that the members of the Realigning Resources for Mission (RRM) Committee have developed after much prayers, thorough data analysis, discussion with the priests, deacons, and staff of the diocese. People are invited to join us in person for this event or to watch a YouTube presentation either at 6:30 July 29th or at that time or at their convenience on the diocesan YouTube page. Those who plan to join us in person are invited to go to the diocesan webpage for RRM to help us anticipate the number of people who plan to attend the events. Obviously, the local event will be held at Lansing Catholic in the gym next Sunday evening. For those who have not been tracking the progress of the RRM Committee work, there is a lot of information at the diocese website. We have a link on our website to the RRM site and a link to rsvp for those who plan to join us in person.

Gathering Feedback and Next Steps

For those who are present in person at the events, they will have a chance to ask questions about the proposed changes in that particular region. Those who join us in person and those who watch the YouTube feed at home either next Sunday or early that week will have the opportunity to share feedback by way of a survey instrument which is likely to close Wednesday of that week (September 1). After we review that feedback, the RRM Committee will present our final set of recommendations to Bishop Boyea by October 1, 2021. (The Priestly Convocation, which will be held September 27-30 will focus on Realigning Resources for Mission.)

Bishop's BBQ for Vocations

A very low pressure opportunity will be held this afternoon for those who are curious about what it might mean to take a further step in discerning a call to the priesthood. If you are open to come and see what a next step of discernment might entail, please consider joining me, my brother priests, and Bishop Boyea this afternoon (Sunday, August 22). Beginning at 3:00 p.m. at Bethany House in DeWitt, there will be a BBQ and time for fellowship and prayer for those young men (and even those not so young) who are curious about seminary and/or feel a call from the Lord to give their lives in service to the Lord. If you are a junior in high school or older who has wondered if God might be inviting you to consider the priesthood, email me or talk to me after Mass.
