"Ordinary Time"

Today, we celebrate the 2nd Sunday in Ordinary Time. There is nothing "ordinary" or "plain" about "ordinary time." The name stems from the word ordinal, meaning "numbered." The Latin for this liturgical period, which makes up the majority of our Liturgical Year, is Tempus Per Annum, which means "time throughout the year." We do have special seasons during the year, but every Sunday of Ordinary Time is a day of obligation. We have an extraordinary opportunity to experience God's redemptive love for us when we gather together as a community of faith at Mass. Each and every time we celebrate the Holy Sacrifice of the Mass, we recall Christ's Incarnation, His Death, His Resurrection, His Ascension, and the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon us for the forgiveness of sins. So, because the time we spend at Mass is anything but *ordinary* (after all, the Sacrifice of Christ on Calvary is made present, and Heaven comes to earth!), it is essential that we come each week (or even more often) to celebrate the Mass, to remember how extraordinary our life is in Christ.

What a great event it was a week ago at the Twelfth Night Celebration! As I mentioned last weekend in my Sunday homilies, the second annual celebration of Epiphany was a resounding success. Thanks to all those who made the evening such a great time of food, drink, music, poetry, and fellowship. Sean and Liz O'Neill, Teresa Spalding and her crew of cooks, Debbie McPherson, Steve Simonson, Piper Fountain, Joel Stanewich, Chris Spalding, Sean Riley, David Kerr and a host of others contributed to making for a wonderful evening. I want to also express thanks to all those poets, musicians, and singers who shared their talents. What a wonderful evening it was, and we look forward to having additional events in the future where members of the parish and community can share their talents and gifts with us.

From the Bishop about Ten Deans (including me):

Initially, it was thought [the vision for Realignment of Resources for Mission] could best be facilitated through our priests operating a shared pastorate over a group of parishes. This is what Canon 543 of the Code of Canon Law refers to as in solidum. However, we soon received word that Rome will not allow priests in solidum to be pastors of individual parishes.

What is more, our priests didn't like the in solidum concept either preferring, instead, to maintain the traditional link between a pastor and his people, between the shepherd and his flock. This was all good feedback and has been duly incorporated into the

implementation of the Realign Resources for Mission vision, a process we've entitled **Made for Mission**.

Hence the more recent move to 22 parish groups organized within 10 deanery territories with each led by a priest who is nominated as a dean. Canon 555 of the Code of Canon Law lays out nicely the responsibilities for a dean. These includes:

- To promote and coordinate common pastoral activity
- To ensure that local clerics lead a life in keeping with their state
- To ensure that local clerics perform their duties diligently
- To ensure that religious functions are celebrated according to liturgical prescripts
- To ensure that the beauty and elegance of churches and sacred furnishings are maintained carefully, especially in the Eucharistic celebration and custody of the Eucharist
- To ensure that, according to particular law, clerics attend lectures, theological meetings, or Conferences
- To take care that spiritual supports are available to presbyters of his district and to show concern for those who are in difficult circumstances or beset by problems.

I have now selected the priests for this role through a consultative process involving the priests, the chancery staff as well as other trusted advisors.

I will be serving as Dean, beginning in July, of the "Lansing Deanery," which includes the following parishes and groups:

- Lansing North: Church of the Resurrection, St Andrew Dung-Lac, St Mary Cathedral, and St Therese.
- East Lansing/Shiawassee: St Mary, Morrice and St Thomas Aquinas (includes St. John Church & Student Center, East Lansing)
- Eastern Ingham: St Martha and St Mary, Williamston

Please pray for me, the other nine deans, and the entire diocese as we anticipate this new structure, which will go into effect in July. Come, Holy Spirit!
