For the next six Thursday evenings, you are invited to join others in watching and discussing an episode of *Chosen* from the first season. I very much encourage you to consider joining the others who will enjoy this dramatic representation of the ministry of the Lord.

Christ is Risen!

I have to say, one of my favorite resurrection accounts is the one in today's gospel, which is known as the Road to Emmaus. We see patterned in this account what happens every time we celebrate the Mass. We bring with us along the journey the burdens of our lives. For the two disciples it was their sadness over the death of Jesus. Without them recognizing Jesus, he accompanied them and engaged them in conversation about the various things that had occurred in Jerusalem, along with their hopes that Jesus had, in fact, been raised from the dead. Jesus then opened up the scriptures for them, outlining how they foretold his coming, his death, and his resurrection. Then they asked him to stay with them, and then he took bread, blessed it, broke it, and gave it to them. And they recognized him in the breaking of the bread. This is what happens every time we celebrate the Mass. Like them, we are fed from the Table of the Word and from the Table of the Eucharist. Let us be open with the Lord about what is troubling us, and let him meet us where we are, to unfold the scriptures in prayer, and to feed us with himself. Come, Holy Spirit!

Deaneries and Deans

This past week, along with others who have been asked to serve as Deans met with Bishop Boyea for some training about what the responsibilities and expectations are for them. Bishop Boyea sent out an email earlier this year announcing the following: Canon 555 of the Code of Canon Law lays out nicely the responsibilities for a dean:

- To promote and coordinate common pastoral activity
- To ensure that local clerics lead a life in keeping with their state
- To ensure that local clerics perform their duties diligently
- To ensure that religious functions are celebrated according to liturgical prescripts
- To ensure that the beauty and elegance of church es and sacred furnishings are maintained care fully, especially in the Eucharistic celebration and custody of the Eucharist
- To ensure that, according to particular law, clerics attend lectures, theological meetings, or conferences
- To take care that spiritual supports are available to presbyters of his district and to show concern for those who are in difficult circumstances or beset by problems.


Bishop has asked me to serve as one of the ten Deans, beginning in July. I will be Dean of the "Lansing Deanery," which will include the following groups:

- Lansing North: Church of the Resurrection, St Andrew Dung-Lac, St Mary Cathedral, and St Therese.
- East Lansing/Shiawassee: St Mary, Morrice and St Thomas Aquinas (includes St. John Church & Student Center, East Lansing)
- Eastern Ingham: St Martha's (Okemos) and St Mary's, Williamston

Please pray for me, the other nine deans, and the entire diocese as we anticipate this new structure, which will go into effect in July. I will of course continue in my role as pastor here. I think the Lord is going to bless this initiative, but I invite you to join me in calling on the Lord for His leading. Come, Holy Spirit!
