Unemployment and poverty are most rampant in the communities. The Archdiocese depends on outside contributions to support its clergy, seminarians, catechists, and the humanitarian projects of the homes for the orphans, aged and destitute, which provide food, shelter, health care, and education. In 2021 Cyclone "Tauktae" left hundreds of families homeless. Monsoon sea-erosion each year, destroys several homes of the fishermen who live near the sea and make a living from fishing. The Archdiocese is yet to recover from the crippling effects of financial devastation caused by the pandemic lockdowns. We humbly request your generous contribution to the second collection. The Gift of the Priesthood

Last weekend, I spoke about the gift and call of the priesthood, giving thanks for the ordination of Frs. Corey Bilodeau and Shea Kettner. This weekend, as we celebrate fathers, and just as we celebrated the Solemnity of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and the Immaculate Heart of Mary, this powerful reflection from St. John Vianney, patron of parish priests, from his *Catechism on the Priesthood* is worth reading:

Saint Bernard tells us that everything has come to us through Mary; and we may also say that everything has come to us through the priest; yes, all happiness, all graces, all heavenly gifts. If we had not the Sacrament of Orders, we should not have Our Lord. Who placed Him there, in that tabernac*le? It was the priest. Who was it that received your* soul, on its entrance into life? The priest. Who nourishes it, to give it strength to make its pilgrimage? The priest. Who will prepare it to appear before God, by washing that soul, for the last time, in the blood of Jesus Christ? The priest -- always the priest. And if that soul comes to the point of death, who will raise it up, who will restore it to calmness and peace? Again the priest. You cannot recall one single blessing from God without finding, side by side with this recollection, the image of the priest.

Vocations Are a Gift from God

I'm grateful for the men and women who have heard the call from God here at the Church of the Resurrection in the past. Their call has been heard because of what God has done in their hearts in and through our parish, and most especially within families where vocations are honored and discussed. We are grateful for the continuing process of discernment among Mason Abbott, Thomas Crowley, and Charlie Gates from our parish, as they discern their call to priesthood as seminarians. Thomas will begin major seminary this fall and will be studying at the North American College in Rome. Mason will be a senior at St. John Vianney Seminary (at University of St. Thomas) in St. Paul, MN. Charlie will begin his studies at SJV as a "new man." Please pray for them and for all those men whom the Lord is calling to the process of discernment. The Lord loves an open heart, and I think it's valuable to remind everyone that attending seminary doesn't, of course, mean more than that one is pursuing/continuing discernment. For those who are ordained, the Lord's call becomes clearer over time, and is ratified interiorly and by the Church.
