

Annual Mission Appeal Is This Weekend

This weekend, at all masses, Rev. Lenin Raj will be speaking about the works and the needs of the Latin Archdiocese of Trivandrum in India. Trivandrum has about 270,000 Catholics. 90% of the people belongs to fishermen community, majority of whom depends on fishing for their livelihood. 10% are farm workers who are recent converts from low caste Hindus. Unemployment and poverty are most rampant in the communities. The Archdiocese depends on outside contributions to support its clergy, seminarians, catechists, and the humanitarian projects of the homes for the orphans, aged and destitute, which provide food, shelter, health care, and education. In 2021 Cyclone "Tauktae" left hundreds of families homeless. Monsoon sea-erosion each year, destroys several homes of the fishermen who live near the sea and make a living from fishing. The Archdiocese is yet to recover from the crippling effects of financial devastation caused by the pandemic lockdowns. We humbly request your generous contribution to the second collection. Your sacrifice for the Missions is deeply appreciated.

As I have mentioned over the past few weeks, I would like to encourage members of the parish to consider serving the Lord by serving on one our councils or commissions. As you may or may not know, we currently have a Parish Pastoral Council and a Finance Council, and one active commission, the School Commission. We are planning to soon establish two additional commissions: the Worship Commission and the Evangelization and Discipleship Commission. We are inviting members of the parish to prayerfully consider nominating themselves for one of these commissions or councils. If you are interested, please complete the application for membership on councils and commissions, which you can find on the parish website or at the office. All members of these councils and commissions need to be active members of our parish who are also fully-initiated (baptized & confirmed) Catholics in good standing with the Church. The Parish Pastoral Council will review the applications at their next meeting, so I invite individuals to submit applications (for this round) no later than July 3, 2023. Reverence at Mass (Summer Attire Edition)

Last week, I posted this, and I'm doing so again, in case some of you missed the bulletin last week. As we enjoy summer, it is well, at this time of year, to remind everyone about the importance of dressing appropriately for Mass. Most especially on the weekends, shorts are not appropriate attire for worship. Ideally, we would never wear jeans either, in the summer or the rest of the year. Imagine that we are (for we ARE) coming into the presence of our Lord. What would we wear to meet Him and to receive Him "under our roof"? I'm confident that we would wear our "Sunday best" in order to honor Him. Let's encourage each other, and dress modestly and appropriately this summer. This is especially true of those who are exercising various ministries at Mass. Thank you.

Thinking Back ...

Back in 2012, Fr. Mark Rutherford and I were anticipating coming to this parish. As we prepared, I wrote my first bulletin article for the weekend of July 1. As I've done before, I think it's helpful for me to share what was on my heart at that time. Excerpts from my first bulletin Article 7/1/12:

Encountering Christ

My priesthood has been marked by a strong desire to help others encounter Christ in a powerful, life-changing way. I am thankful for the long legacy of evangelization, discipleship, and service that has marked this great parish. I look forward to building on the strong foundation that has been established here. Together, let us prayerfully labor to make our parish an even more effective place of genuine encounter with the Love of God.

God is Love

I take these words of Pope Benedict XVI, from his first encyclical, Deus Caritas Est, as a principle that informs my ministry as pastor and Superintendent of Catholic schools: "Being Christian is not the result of an ethical choice or a lofty idea, but the encounter with an event, a person, which gives life a new horizon and a decisive direction Since God has first loved us (cf. I Jn 4:10), love is now no longer a mere 'command'; it is the response to the gift of love with which God draws near to us." As I see things, our response to this gift of God's love is to strive, by the power of the Holy Spirit, to help others encounter the One who is Love, the One who "draws near to us." As a parish, I hope and pray that together we will strive to grow in our love of God and neighbor and to share that love with others.

First Things First

The ground of encounters with Christ is tilled and fertilized by prayer. Prayer must begin, sustain, and be the end of all our efforts. As Fr. Mark and I begin our service here, we are resolved to continue the strong legacy of prayer at this parish and school. As we move forward, may Resurrection parish (and school) be even more widely known as a place of prayer, a house of prayer, a school of prayer. If that happens, then our various apostolates—our school, the hospital, ministry to the young and old, and especially to the "least of these"—will radiate our witness in this city that so desperately needs Jesus.

I think the Lord has honored our intentions, and blessed us greatly, thanks in large measure to the wonderful team we have working here and the parishioners who give so much in terms of witness and service. Keep praying, if you would, for the staff of our parish, and the future collaboration in our Parish Group and Deanery.
