Church Renovation Update

Many of you have seen the renderings that are in the vestibule of the church. Some of you mentioned that the design seems significantly changed from what you recalled seeing. That's not for no reason. The original proposal was modified through discussion with the original architect, our committee, and the diocesan Liturgical Design Commission. We originally only had an altar rail in the center, but after time passing, and more discussion, we determined that it wold be prudent to increase the number of seats in the church, which was possible by reorienting the pews back to the original design (with, as you may have seen, angles on the two outside banks of pews). This gains us over 100 additional seats, which seems prudent while we're doing the renovations. We also extended the altar rail the whole width of the church, which will make it possible for people to receive kneeling wherever they are sitting in the church. The reredos, which is the wooden backdrop where the tabernacle will be, as well as the altar and ambo, are being designed by a different architect. We hope to have renderings of those by September to share with you, and to get approved by the diocese. Please note that our current crucifix will be featured in the reredos above the tabernacle. Our hopes, as I've mentioned at Mass, is that the work on the renovation will begin by mid-April. We haven't worked out, obviously, all the details for daily Mass and weekend Masses, but we have some good ideas for that. We will share those details as they develop. Please keep all of this in prayer, as we proceed.

Councils and Commissions

The Parish Pastoral Council met this past week to review applications and to make appointments and to draw lots for positions on the various councils and commissions. It was a time bathed in prayer, and we are grateful for the desire on the part of members of the parish to serve in these various capacities. We will be letting individuals know about their appointment to these bodies in coming weeks, and will announce their names in the bulletin and on the website shortly thereafter. Please pray for them and for the staff of the parish as we seek to serve the Lord more faithfully, in order to worship well and better form missionary disciples who know, love, and serve the Lord. Thank you!


