The Healing Power of the Spirit

When I preached to the priests on retreat, I quoted

this section from Fr. Wilfrid Stinissen's book *Into* Your Hands, Father: Abandoning Ourselves to the God Who Loves Us. I offer it to us all for our prayerful meditation. It is, truly, transformative. It is characteristic of the Spirit to place everything in a larger context. He reveals that the Father was present in all that you experienced in your life. What looked so terrible and caused such pain was in reality not so bad. "... In all their affliction he was afflicted, and the angel of his presence saved them. . . . He lifted them up and carried them all the days of old" (Is 63:9). God carried you when you thought that you were faltering; he surrounded you with his love when you felt you were abandoned. The Spirit helps you to see the whole of reality and not just a small fragment. It is possible that you were not welcome when you were born into this cold world, but God has welcomed you. "Before I formed you in the womb I knew you" (Jer 1:5); "... borne by me from your birth, carried from the womb" (Is 46:3). Perhaps your mother did not have time for you when you were small. Perhaps you felt abandoned by her. Maybe you were harassed in school, or you are simply so sensitive and vulnerable that what is insignificant to others caused deep wounds in you. But now, in the light of the Spirit, you understand that you were never really left alone. "I have called you by name, you are mine. When you pass through the waters I will be with you; and through the rivers, they shall not overwhelm you; when you walk through fire, you shall not be burned; the flame shall not consume you. . . . Fear not, for I am with you" (Is 43:1-2, 5). "I am with you." He can truly say this, for he has gone through all of it himself. He has experienced the indifference, hardness, and cruelty of mankind. He has suffered through all your anguish, loneliness, and despair. Everything that wounds you has wounded him first. He has freely taken all of it upon himself, so that you should never have to say that you are alone. You can never say to him: "You do not know what this is, you do not know what you are speaking about." Yes, he knows. He has already suffered everything. All fear, loneliness, and disappointment have been gathered together in him. It has received a positive stamp by the fact that he has gone through it. Every time a painful memory comes back, you can, so to speak, welcome it in Jesus name. All your memories are also his memories, and your wounds are his wounds. (pp. 39-40). Ignatius Press.
