Reminder About "Last Gospel" and Marian Antiphons

Some who are new to the parish or who weren't around when I wrote and spoke about why we read the "Last Gospel" after the final blessing may find these comments helpful:

Some parishioners will remember that the Mass prior to Vatican II use to conclude with the reading of John 1:1-14, which, because it was proclaimed after the conclusion of Mass, was called "The Last Gospel." We have been reciting the Last Gospel for about a year and a half now, and it is a great reminder to me of the central tenet of our faith: the incarnation.

In the beginning was the Word, and the Word was with God, and the Word was God. He was in the beginning with God. All things came to be through him, and without him nothing came to be. What came to be through him was life, and this life was the light of the human race; the light shines in the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it.

It's very familiar to us, of course, and we do well to recall and celebrate the truth that God came among us as Light. The mystery is profound, and we're caught up into it. Through our own baptism, God has enlightened us, and made us bearers of the Light of Christ. *The light shines in*

the darkness, and the darkness has not overcome it. And that will continue to be true, come what may; come whatever may!

Reminding Ourselves after Every Mass

Beginning a year and a half ago, I began to proclaim John 1:1-14 after the Marian Antiphon (or another suitable hymn) after the conclusion of the Mass. As you have seen, the events after the final blessing follow this sequence:

Final Blessing

The celebrant will reverence the altar, and depart the sanctuary, genuflect, then read the "Last Gospel." As the old custom had it, we genuflect at the verse which says, "and the word became flesh . . "

After that, the faithful will be invited to recite the St. Michael Prayer with the priest.

After that, we will sing the seasonally appropriate Marian Antiphon or other appropriate hymn as the recessional.

Marian Antiphons

At many of our Masses with music, we conclude with the seasonal Marian Antiphon. The Marian Antiphons are traditionally sung after Night Prayer. We are choosing to use them often for our recessional. The tradition for singing the various hymns is as follows:

- 1) Alma Redemptoris Mater (Loving Mother of the Redeemer) begins after Evening Prayer I of Advent Sunday through the Feast of the Presentation.
- 2) Ave Regina Caelorum begins after Evening Prayer I on February 1 if February 2 (the Feast of the Presentation) falls on a Sunday. If February 2 does not fall on a Sunday, we begin singing Ave Regina Caelorum (Hail, Queen of Heaven) on February 2, not the night before, and this song is is sung through Lent.
- 3) The switch to *Regina Caeli* (Queen of Heaven) begins at Evening Prayer II of Easter.
- 4) Salve Regina (Hail Holy Queen) begins with Night Prayer after Evening Prayer II on Pentecost.

These four Marian hymns are beautiful reflections on the grace and gift of a redeemer, and the prayerfulness of the Mother of the Redeemed, the Blessed Virgin Mary. May we honor her well, and learn these beautiful hymns in her honor.


