Clarification/Correction

Last weekend, when I apologized for having closed the church when the Covid outbreak occurred, I said that I would do all I could to keep the church open. At one or more of the Masses, I said that if Bishop Boyea's successor (whenever that might happen) were to ask me to close the church, I would not do so on pain of removal. What I should have said is that I would appeal to this or a future bishop to keep the church open, if I were not able to prayerfully agree with the bishop's recommendation about closure. In that case, I would tell him that I could not, in good conscience, do so. If necessary, I would tender my resignation, so strongly do I believe that I was wrong to close down the church that first weekend in March of 2020. Please note: I do not expect our bishop or a future bishop to ask us to close down the churches again. Please pray for me, for all priests, and for our bishop and all bishops. Thank you.

Solemnity of All Saints

Wednesday, November 1, with all the Church, we celebrate the Solemnity of All Saints. This year, it is a Holy Day of Obligation, so we will offer three Masses, one at 8:15 a.m. (School Mass), one at 12:00 Noon, and one at 6:00 p.m. We remember the saints and call upon them as we pray the Mass. May we be "caught up" in the hope we have as we celebrate our brothers and sisters who have "made it home" to heaven.

Commemoration of All the Faithful Departed (All Souls)

November 2 is All Souls' Day, when we pray for all our beloved dead, that they will be purified of any attachments to the things of earth. We fail in our charity if we neglect to pray for those who have died. One wise priest, when asked when we should stop praying for our deceased loved ones, said (as if it were obvious), "When they're canonized." Until then, let's not stop praying for them. We will offer three Masses that day, one at 8:15 a.m. (School Mass), one at 12:00 noon, and one at 6:00 p.m. (See note below about Mass for those who have died in the last year, which will be celebrated at 11:00 a.m. on November 11th.)

School Auction on November 11

I am very glad that we have a school at our parish. The fruits of that ministry are growing, and we pray that all of our students, faculty, staff, and families will become the saints we are "making." Each year, we have an auction that allows members of the school, parish, and community to gather in order to celebrate the school, to enjoy food and fellowship, and to participate in a silent and live auction. This year's auction will be November 11 after the evening Mass. Join us in Mercy Hall. It is a great time and a worthy cause! The charge is nominal. \$10 per person, \$15 per couple, and \$ for seniors. We want you to come, so the cost is minimal. Please join us, and help us raise money to support families who want to partner with us for the education of their students. Thanks!

Praying for the Dead



November 1st marks a great solemnity in the Church: the *Solemnity of All Saints*. At our Baptism, we are all called by God to holiness. This means that we are all "saints in the making!" To make this great day even more festive, the school will be hosting our annual "All Saints' Day Festival". Each child (K-6th grade) will be asked to choose a saint and come dressed as that saint on the morning of **Wednesday, November 1st**. The 7th and 8th graders will be hosting the event, dressed as angels *(angel costume is provided)*.

Your child's saint costume can be very simple. Please be creative with this, using simple items/materials from your home - you do not need to go out and buy things.

Your child should come dressed in costume at the *start* of the day on Tuesday, November 1st. All the "saints" will attend Mass that morning in full costume (a visual glimpse of what actually happens at *every* Mass, as we join all of Heaven in this act of worship). A "Parade of Saints" will take place immediately after Mass, followed by the actual festival. We hope you can join us for the festivities! Younger brothers and sisters accompanied by an adult are welcome to join in on the fun.

We are always looking for parent volunteers to assist in making this a very special day for the children. We have most the volunteer spots filled for setup and clean up, but we can always use more volunteers to help during the event. Please let school office know if you are able to help during the festival. We are so grateful for your support – we couldn't do it without you!

I also want to remind families that **Wednesday, November 1st** is a half-day due to the Solemnity of All-Saints day. There will be an 8:15 AM Mass and Noon Mass for families to attend together. School children would not be required to attend both. Please let the school office know if your children are going to arrive after the 8:15 AM Mass because your family is attending the Noon Mass together. We will not count that as an absence or tardy if we know the reason for the late arrival.
