Happy Catholic Schools Week!

As we conclude Catholic Schools Week, I want to again thank you for your generous support of our parish and school. I somehow neglected last week to thank Judie Mirabelli-Migaldi, who is our Little Shamrocks Pre-school Director, and Marianne Vasievich, who coordinates our Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program. They, along with the rest of the school and parish staff, make possible the great work that we celebrated this past week. Thank you! As it says on our school letterhead, we've been "forming disciples of Christ since 1926." What a great legacy of faith we have! Thank you for your continuing support of our parish and the school.

1926 Legacy Fund

I am pleased to announce the inauguration of the 1926 Legacy Fund, which will be used to help families with demonstrated need afford to partner with us for the education of their children. Please see the flier for more information about the fund, and suggested ways to make a donation. Thank you!

Witness to Hope (WTH) Funds Reallocation

The parish has been, as you know, anticipating an expanded renovation/restoration of the church. Back in 2017, we had originally proposed two major projects for which we raised funds: 1) The sanctuary renovation, which we estimated would cost \$750,000 and 2) Connecting the two school buildings, with a secure entrance, which we estimated would cost \$1,200,000. Since that time, we have made improvements to security on campus, and purchased a portable lift for accessibility purposes. These two modest improvements have solved most of the needs we highlighted in our preparation for the capital campaign. At the time of the original WTH campaign, I mentioned my desire eventually to get new lighting and increase the number of seats in the church, and so we have developed plans to that end. The cost of the expanded sanctuary and nave renovation is estimated to total approximately \$1,500,000. As a result, we are hoping to repurpose WTH funds to cover the cost of this expanded renovation/restoration of the

Diocesan policy requires that we apprise you of this proposal. In coming weeks, we will be sending letters to all WTH donors who donated \$10,000 or more, requesting their approval to make this change. They will have 30 days to respond. Should any of them refuse to have their funds reallocated, we will offer to return the proportion of their donation we hoped to reallocate. For your information, our WTH fund at the end of December 31, 2023 totaled \$1,598,137. We have additional funds, including approximately \$100,000 in our "Sanctuary Beautification Fund," that we can apply to this project should some WTH donors decide they are not supportive of this reallocation. If you have concerns or questions about this, please let me know. [I will run this notice in the bulletin again next week.]

Follow-up Regarding "Prayer Prescription"

I preached last week about what Fr. Chad Ripperger and other exorcists call the "initial prayer prescription."

What one should do is based on a person's formal, sacramental relationship with God and the Church: Non-baptized, (the baptism must be in the Trinitarian form): Angelus three times per day 6 a.m., 12, & 6pm Baptized: above Angelus, plus these prayers: https://auxiliumchristianorum.org/prayers/ three times daily. Baptized & first comm: above, plus Confiteor at noon. Fully initiated: above, plus act of contrition at 6 p.m. Fully initiated, non-practicing (in habitual mortal sin): above, plus pray Psalm 130 three times daily. Other prayers, disciplines, devotions can be used. In addition:

Media fast: no social media, internet, games, television... Media use is restricted to those activities related to work, vocation, and school.

Gregorian chant 24/7 at low volume

Pray the Rosary daily.

Burning of blessed candles to dispel night terrors or evil presence(s), as needed; Sacred art & images should replace secular mags & images.

If you are using this as part of a diagnostic prayer due to suspected diabolic affliction, this regimen should be done under the supervision of your parish priest, confessor, or spiritual director. For those who are doing this as a private devotion, the set prayers/hours should be met, but the other disciplines may be done according to one's prudential judgment. Schneider, Daniel R.. Perimeter Prayer

This prayer can be prayed by laity. It should be prayed by the head of the household with all members of the household present. Lord Jesus Christ, in thy love and mercy establish a perimeter of protection around N. and myself and all our loved ones, those who pray for us and their loved ones. May the Holy Angels guard him/her/us and all our possessions, establishing a perimeter of protection around N., rendering him/her/us immune from any kind of demonic influence. I ask that no demonic bondage, door, demonic entity, portal, astral projection, or disembodied spirit may enter the space of 100 yards in all directions of him/her/us. I ask that any demons within this vicinity or any that should try to enter here be rendered deaf, dumb and blind; that Thou would strip them of all weapons, armor, power, illusions, and authority; that Thou would bind, rebuke and disable them from communicating or interacting with each other in any way. Remove them, sending them directly to the foot of Thy Cross. Jesus, Son of the Most High, I ask this in Thy Glorious and Most Holy Name. *Amen.* After this, sprinkle holy water around the perimeter of the home. (Ripperger, Father Chad A..
