Beginning Lent Well

Many of us gathered Ash Wednesday to begin our Lenten Journey together,. The Lord delights in the response of His people to the call to repentance and self -denial. As the Gospel Wednesday made clear, the Lord invites us to three wonderful practices during Lent. Through the Church, the Holy Spirit calls each of us to pray, fast, and give alms. The Lord says, in each instance, when you pray, fast, and give alms. The point is that to be Christian *is* to pray, fast, and give alms. That is what sons and daughters of God do, for it reveals to us what they *are* in Christ. We are called to be intimate with our Father in heaven, so we pray. We look forward to our home in heaven and want our appetites to be tuned to eternal things, so we *fast*. We are parts of one Body, sharing in the challenges of those around us, so we give alms.

Growing in Prayer

My prayer for each of us is that we would grow in prayer this Lent. Praying to the Lord from our heart is a great practice all the time, and Lent can be a special invitation from Him to do so. The prayer of prayers is the Mass, and I encourage you to attend Mass during the week, if you've rarely (or never) taken time to do so. Another opportunity for each of us is to make a visit to Jesus sometime during the day, especially on Fridays when we have exposition throughout the day, or during our Holy Hours on Wednesday (from 6:30-7:30 p.m.) or on Friday (from 5:30-6:30 p.m.). We will also be praying the Stations of the Cross on Fridays just after Benediction at 6:30 or so. Let's pray well, that we will be drawn deeper into the heart of God.

The Spiritual Battle

On Ash Wednesday, the opening prayer (or "collect") reminded us of what this Season of Lent is all about. We prayed: *Grant, O Lord, that we may begin with holy* fasting this campaign of Christian service, so that, as we take up battle against spiritual evils, we may be armed with weapons of self-restraint. Through our Lord Jesus Christ, your Son, who lives and reigns with you in the unity of the Holy Spirit, God, for ever and ever. As you know, in past weeks, I have been talking about the spiritual battle, and recommending that individuals and families consider taking up the discipline of the "Prayer Protocol" or "Prayer Regimen," which is on the back of the handout located near the exits (the sheet is entitled "Reflections on and Excerpts from *The Liber Christo Method*"). I've reached out to the leaders of *Liber Christo* to ask them what they recommend priests/ pastors tell those whose schedules make 6:00 a.m. difficult for the early morning prayer of *The Angelus*, but have not heard back from them.

Flexibility in Application of the Prayer Regimen

For now, my best sense is that if you (and your family) are doing this prayer regimen as a private devotion (not to discern "extraordinary diabolical activity"), it would be best to have a set time in the early-ish morning to commit to pray *The Angelus*. Such a regular time, rather than "whenever we wake up" allows for the establishment and reinforcement of the discipline of the rule of life and prayer to be exercised. It seems important to state that any aspects/elements of the Prayer Regimen you choose will be helpful, even if you don't think you can start with the whole thing. NB: If you (or ones you love) *are* dealing with what you or they believe is *extraordinary diabolical activity*, please have them speak with me or another priest.

Men's Lenten Morning of Reflection (February 24)

Men and boys (middle school and up) are invited to our Lenten Morning of Reflection in Mercy Hall. The title is, *Fathers and Brothers in the Spiritual Battle*. I will be offering two talks, followed by discussion questions at tables. The first talk, "Fathers and Faith," addresses the indispensable role fathers play in forming their children as disciples and protecting them spiritually. The second talk, "Becoming a Band of Brothers," explores how good friends help us survive the spiritual battle. Our morning will conclude with Exposition in the church at 11:30, where confession will also be made available. Benediction will be at 12:30 for all those wishing to stay until that time. Please register online.

Deanery Mission March 3-5 at St. Thomas Aquinas

The Lansing Deanery will host its first Deanery Mission "The Holy Spirit: The Presence, the Power, and the Promise." It will be held March 3-5, 2024 from 6:30 p.m.-8:30 p.m. at St. Thomas Aquinas in East Lansing, with Dr. Mary Healy as the presenter. Here's the summary of what it will entail: At Pentecost the Holy Spirit came down on the apostles and changed their lives forever. Throughout the history of the Church, the Holy Spirit has empowered miracleworkers, emboldened martyrs, and imbued the saints with the grace of heroic virtue. But who is the Holy Spirit? In this three-evening mission we will not only explore the nature of the Holy Spirit, but call on Him to heal us, open us to our own Pentecost, and equip us to live lives of holiness and love. Please pray for those who will come to the mission, and I hope that you will consider joining us and inviting others to attend, as well. Thanks!
