Church Renovation Townhall Meeting (March 18)

As I mentioned last week, we are hoping to be able to get started with our renovations two weeks after Easter. We are making plans for the duration of the time when we will not be able to use the church, and want to share those plans with you and to hear your questions and comments about them. We will have a meeting on Monday, March 18, at 7:00 p.m. in Mercy Hall to discuss our plans and to hear your comments. Join us if you are able. No need to RSVP.

Tentative Plans

At this point we are planning to have daily Masses (Monday, Wednesday, Thursday, Friday and Saturday morning) in Mercy Hall, along with confessions, which will be heard in the east end conference room. Lansing Catholic High School has graciously allowed us to have Masses in their beautiful chapel, and we have tentatively planned to have three morning Masses on Sundays, at 8:00 a.m., 9:30 a.m., and 11:30 a.m., the times we used during Covid. It may take some time to figure out how to divide ourselves up evenly to fit in their smaller space, but I trust that we will make adjustments ourselves without having to register for Masses. Their chapel seats around 285. Note that for the duration of the construction, we will not have either the Saturday evening or Sunday evening Masses at LCHS. That will allow us to open and close Lansing Catholic High School just once each weekend. Those who prefer evening Saturday or Sunday Masses will (of course) have the option of attending other area Masses. I'm hopeful that one of the morning Mass times will work for most parishioners. These arrangements will obviously have to be for the

duration of the renovation work, which could be five months or more. We are hoping to have it completed in late August or early September, but we can't make any guarantees. It goes without saying that this will be a hard-ship for everyone, and will require sacrifices and accommodations. I think I can speak for most of us when I say that I look forward to the finished project. In this Lenten season, I find myself seeing this period of sacrifice as a long "passion" that will lead to a rebirth/renewal of our church. If you would, please keep the project and each other in prayer. Thanks!

Vacation Bible School 2024

Due to the scheduled renovation of the Church, our campus will not be available to host our usual VBS program this summer. This decision was difficult to make and we apologize for the sacrifice and hardship this creates for our students and families who look forward to VBS every summer. Be assured that our VBS program is scheduled to resume as usual in June of 2025. We are collecting data from area parishes regarding their VBS programming and will send out this information to our families as soon as possible, so that families can register their kids with parishes within our wider Parish Grouping or Deanery. Thank you for understanding.

This year, it will be celebrated on April 8, 2024.) If it's been a while since you were last at confession, don't rob yourself or those you love of the grace of forgiveness. The Lord allows us to begin again when we go to confession.




