



Congratulations to those who made their First Communion

Yesterday morning (Saturday), I had the privilege of celebrating the First Holy Communion Mass for members of our parish and school. It was, as always, a great joy to be able to offer Jesus to children who have been looking forward to this day for a very long time. Please pray for them and for their families, that they might continue to grow in their love of Jesus and their desire for and openness to the graces of the Blessed Sacrament.

So It Begins . . .

We're underway now, in terms of the renovation. Please pray for all of those who will be part of the renovation process, and for each other, as we deal with the various challenges during the coming months. As I mentioned over the last few weeks, our Sunday Masses will be held at Lansing Catholic High School Chapel at 8:00 a.m., 9:30 a.m., and 11:30 a.m. (We will not offer Saturday or Sunday Evening Masses during the renovation.) Daily Masses and confessions will be held in Mercy Hall (enter by the main entrance off Rumsey). These changes will be in effect until the renovations have progressed far enough for us to use the church again, most likely be late August or September. (Some aspects of the renovation will not be completed by that time, but we will be able to use the church again.) Again, please be patient with us as we make this transition, and let us know if there are issues and concerns that you have.

Selling the Rectory (1715 Jerome St.)

Most of you know that I have moved into the old St. Casimir rectory, and now live with Fr. Jim Rolph and Fr. Vince Richardson. The Finance Council has approved the sale of the rectory, and the diocese has approved the sale as well. My hope is to sell it to someone in the Resurrection Family, and so we are going to open it up to families and individuals here first. The Liturgical Power of the "Road to Emmaus"

This Sunday, we have the second part of Luke's powerful account of the conversation of the disciples and Jesus on the Road to Emmaus. It is a very fitting reading for the Sunday after First Communion is celebrated, because we see in this account a beautiful picture of what happens to us every time we gather as believers to celebrate the Mass. It begins by recounting what the disciples experienced as they were walking to Emmaus. Discouraged, Jesus walked by their side, and opened up the scriptures to them. The two disciples recounted what had taken place on the way, and how Jesus was made known to them in the breaking of bread. While they were still speaking about this, he stood in their midst and said to them, "Peace be with you." He is our peace, and Jesus desires to share his peace with others. After sharing a meal with them, he wanted them to understand what had transpired by unfolding the scriptures for them: He said to them, "These are my words that I spoke to you while I was still with you, that everything written about me in the law of Moses and in the prophets and psalms must be fulfilled." Then he opened their minds to understand the Scriptures. And he said to them, "Thus it is written that the *Christ would suffer and rise from the dead on the third day* and that repentance, for the forgiveness of sins, would be preached in his name to all the nations, beginning from Jerusalem. You are witnesses of these things." We are called to be witnesses not of the resurrection, but of the resurrection life, the life of the spirit. As we continue to journey toward Pentecost, we ask for a fresh outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon us, so that we are better able to live the life of faith, hope, and love that we are called to live. Come, Holy Spirit!


