Not ideal, to be sure, but I believe we can make these arrangements work for the duration. Please keep all of this in your prayers, if you would.

Adding back our Saturday Evening 5:00 p.m. Mass

After the Mass on Monday morning, I realized that we can make Mercy Hall work for Masses, and so we will add back into our schedule the 5:00 p.m. Saturday Mass beginning this coming Saturday. Please note that May 11 is one Saturday that we won't be able to have the evening Mass, because we will have a wedding reception in the hall that evening. We will have copies of the St. Michael Hymnal available on Saturdays in Mercy Hall, and I will invite individuals to be seated during the Eucharistic Prayer if kneeling on the hard floor would be a hardship.

Sean O'Neill's New Position at Faith Catholic.

Beginning May 3, Sean O'Neill will take on a new part time position as editor of *Faith Magazine*. He will continue working here on a half-time basis, as well. He sent me this information to share with you:

The Diocese of Lansing has asked me to take over the editorship of FAITH Magazine and I have agreed to do it. It will be a part-time job of 19 hours per week, while the rest of my time will be spent working at the parish. Fr. Steve has been very supportive and we both believe this is a beneficial change for me. Exactly what my parish job will consist of will be worked out by Fr. Steve and me, between now and my start date at the diocese, May 3. Until then, I will continue to work full-time for Res. I am grateful to Fr. Steve for his willingness to accommodate this change in my employment and for his encouragement.

Good Shepherd Sunday

This, the fourth Sunday of Easter, is Good Shepherd Sunday. Each year, we read from John 10. A few years ago, I read this at Masses. Take some time to reflect on this beautiful reflection in light of Jesus being the "Good Shepherd." A most remarkable thing is the sympathy that exists between a shepherd and his flock. He never drives them as our own shepherds drive their sheep. He always walks at their head, leading them along the roads and over the hills to new pasture: and, as he goes, he sometimes talks to them in a loud sing-song voice, using weird language unlike anything I have ever heard in my life.

The first time I heard sheep and goat language I was on the hills at the back of Jericho. A goat-herd had descended into a valley and was mounting the slope of an opposite hill when, turning round he saw his goats had remained behind to devour a rich patch of scrub It was uncanny because there was nothing human about it. The words were animal sounds arranged in a kind of order. No sooner had he spoken than an answering bleat shivered over the herd, and one or two of the animals turned their heads in his direction. But they did not obey him. The goat-herd then called out one word and gave a laughing kind of whinny. Immediately a goat with a bell around his neck stopped eating and, leaving the herd, trotted down the hill, across the valley and up the opposite slopes. The man, accompanied by this animal, walked on and disappeared round a ledge of rock. Very soon a panic spread among the herd. They forgot to eat. They looked up for the shepherd. He was not to be seen. The became conscious that the leader with the bell at his neck was no longer with them. From the distance came the strange laughing call of the shepherd, and at the sound of it the entire herd stampeded into the hollow and leapt up the hill after him.

.... Early one morning I saw an extraordinary sight not far from Bethlehem. Two shepherds had evidently spent the night with their flocks in a cave. The sheep were all mixed together and the time had come for the shepherds to go in different directions. One of the shepherds stood some distance from the sheep and began to call. First, one, then another, then four or five animals ran towards him; and so on until he had counted his whole flock.

More interesting than the sight of this was the knowledge that Jesus must have seen exactly the same sight and described it in His own word:

"He called his own sheep by name, and led them out.... I am the good shepherd. I know my sheep and mine know me." (H. V. Morton, In the Steps of the Master, p. 154).




