Come, Holy Spirit!

Today, we pray for the Holy Spirit to come . . . fill the hearts of the faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love . . . Just what we've been praying for, since last August. As I've said more than a few times in recent weeks, this prayer "Come, Holy Spirit" is a prayer that the Holy Spirit can't resist. He comes! May we be those who open our hearts to receive with an open heart, mind, and will, the power of the Holy Spirit.

The Holy Spirit Changes Everything

In my homily last week, I mentioned that the Holy Spirit changes everything, at least those "things" that are willing to be changed (including us)! The thought is not, of course, original to me. Countless men and women (boys and girls) have experienced the transformational change that the Lord offers us through the outpouring of the Holy Spirit. St. Ignatius of Laodicea drafted these powerful words, which struck me the first time I heard them, and impress me still:

←WITHOUT THE HOLY SPIRIT,

- —God is distant,
- —Christ stays in the past,
- —the Gospel is a dead letter,
- —the Church is simply an organization,
- —authority is a matter of domination,
- —mission is a matter of propaganda,
- —the liturgical services are no more than a reminder of the past,
- —Christian living is a slave morality.

←BUT WITH THE HOLY SPIRIT.

- —God is with us.
- —the universe is resurrected and groans with the birth pangs of the kingdom,
- —the risen Christ is here,
- —the Gospel is the power of life,
- —the Church is the organism,
- —the Body of the living Christ,
- —authority is service,
- -mission is Pentecost,
- —the liturgy is both memorial and anticipation,
- —human action is God at work in this world.

Take some time this coming week to muse about why Ignatius would say such wondrous things about the Holy Spirit's effects in our world, hearts, and lives.

Mass Intentions

Schedule your intentions for Mass. A Mass intention is a specific petition for which the Mass is offered. Mass intentions can be requested on behalf of another living person—for example, the healing of someone who is sick, or to commemorate a wedding anniversary (but it can be for anything!). Mass intentions are also commonly offered in remembrance of a person who has died. The graces acquired by having a Mass said for a special intention are beyond earthly comprehension. The Mass is the greatest prayer the Body of Christ can offer to God, and therefore the most powerful means to help others and ourselves gain eternity with Him. To schedule an intention, you can either come into the parish office OR call the office and schedule intentions over the phone at 517-482-4749.


