



Week #2: On Ramps

1. POPE FRANCIS'S AND ARCHBISHOP VIGNERON'S VISION FOR US

- a. Becoming a band of joyful missionary disciples.
- b. Accurately see what God created the Church to be, created us to be: individually and as a parish.
- c. The terms we review are a means to assist us with understanding and clarifying the correct meaning, which are often misunderstood by most Catholics.

3. EACH ON RAMP IS DEFINED BY A MUTATED UNDERSTANDING OF THE WORD AND A HEALTHY UNDERSTANDING OF THE WORD

- a. **Faith Mutation**: opinion, one interpretation of reality, optional, an add-on, private. **Healthy:** truth, *the* interpretation of reality, essential, given to be shared.
- b. Church Mutation: institution, our own doing, the hierarchy/ordained ("the Church"). Healthy: organism, God's initiative/called (qahal), the people of God.
- c. **Parish Mutation**: the building where I happen to go to Mass, assimilated. **Healthy**: a community of exiles on a journey, encouraging each other along the way while getting nourished with the food necessary, trying to bring as many people along with us; counter-cultural. (Diognetus)

- d. Laity Mutation: silent spectators, "not my job," consumer, called to less. Healthy: fully participating, the ones primarily responsible for evangelization, called to holiness.
- e. Conversion Mutation: what happens in other peoples' lives (e.g, when the Protestant comes to RCIA, when the pagan becomes Christian); "I'm Catholic because I grew up Catholic, no decision is necessary and if my parents weren't Catholic, I probably wouldn't be either"; it's once and done. Healthy: the only way to become a Christian (can't because parents were or even just because you were baptized). I must make a decision to become a disciple of Jesus. Conversion is ongoing.
- f. Missionary disciple Mutation: that's what Missionary Orders like the Jesuits do in foreign countries. Healthy: the task entrusted to and the identity conferred on every person at baptism, the mission entrusted to every person at every Mass (Ite missa est, "now entering mission territory"); what we are all supposed to do until we get home.

QUOTE: To speak in general terms, we may say that the Christian is to the world what the soul is to the body. As the soul is present in every part of the body, while remaining distinct from it, so Christians are found in all the cities of the world, but cannot be identified with the world. 	"The apostolate in the social milieu, that is, the effort to infuse a Christian spirit into the mentality, customs, laws, and structures of the community in which one lives, is so much the duty and responsibility of the laity that it can never be performed properly by others. In this area the laity can exercise the apostolate of like toward like. It is
	here that they complement the testimony of life with the testimony of the word. It is here where they work or practice their profession or study or reside or spend their leisure time or have their companionship that they are more capable of helping their brethren.
	"The laity fulfill this mission of the Church in the world especially by conforming their lives to their faith so that
	they become the light of the world as well as by practicing honesty in all their dealings so that they attract all to the love of the true and the good and finally to the Church and to Christ." Decree on the Apostolate of the Laity, 13
