

ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

Sunday of the Word of God

Today we celebrate the first ever Sunday of the Word of God. Today we let Jesus open our minds to the beauty of the Scriptures, so we can proclaim the truth of the Good News that they contain. The Scriptures are not dead letters on a page, but living words that have been given life by the Holy Spirit, who also gives light to our minds when we read them. Nor is the Word of God a list of rules, but an invitation to share the life of the living God, their author.

In his letter establishing today's celebration, Pope Francis shares, "It is fitting, then, that the life of our people be constantly marked by this decisive relationship with the living word that the Lord never tires of speaking to his Bride, that she may grow in love and faithful witness" (*Aperuit illis*, 2). Every story told in the Scriptures, even the most challenging, reminds us that God loves his people and will always be faithful to the covenant he has made with us. God sent us his Son, the Word Incarnate, not only to *speak* these words of faithful love, but also to *show* us the depths of faithful love by dying on the cross and rising from the dead. Every word of Scripture points to this message of love enacted in the person of Jesus Christ, who is the Word himself.

In honor of today's celebration, thank the lectors at your parish who proclaim the Word of God and the priests and deacons who preach it. With your family or other parishioners, find a time today to re-read today's Gospel (Matthew 4:12-23) and plan a time this week to read next Sunday's Gospel (Luke 2:22-40). What does God need to teach you and cure within you so you can proclaim the Good News of his kingdom to others?



UNLEASH THE GOSPEL

go and make disciples

We all know the story of the Conversion of St. Paul that the Church celebrates on January 25. It happened on the road to Damascus when Jesus appeared to him. Paul, who was from a Jewish family and trained as a Pharisee, had been persecuting the early Christians.

This life-changing experience led Paul to continue the work Jesus had begun, devoting the rest of his life to spreading the Good News about our salvation through Jesus Christ.

We have great insight into his work from the words of Paul and his followers that are part of the New Testament. And we can all learn something from them.

He knew there was work to be done and he pursued it. There is work for us, too, as we try to share the love and mercy of Jesus with others.

St. Paul was open to God's plan for him. It was in a completely opposite direction from his past, but he embraced his work with zeal. We, too, need to be open to His plan.

Paul went where he needed to be, travelling extensively and establishing Christian communities in various locations. Our opportunities may be right in our own family, parish, neighborhood, workplace or circle of friends.

His approach was to build bridges, not to be critical or aggressive. Pope Francis said that this was especially true when Paul preached about Jesus to idol worshippers in Athens. Paul didn't give up because they were so far apart in their beliefs.

That is similar to situations we face with someone who has "gone astray". Rather than distancing ourselves, we need to keep in touch, listen, and keep the doors of communication open.

St. Paul was great at follow-up. Due to his travels and later imprisonment, he used letters to stay in contact and continue to teach the early Christian communities. He wrote to encourage them, keep them on the right path, and reinforce what he had taught, using logic and some repetition to make his message clear.

These are all good things to consider as we share the love and mercy of Jesus in the 21st century.






