

ANOINTING OF THE SICK/ MINISTRY TO THE SICK

The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours. Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes. Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.



I hope you are enjoying these wonderful days of summer. It has been a bit crazy weather wise, especially with air quality alerts we have had the past month and the other extreme weather swings. Nonetheless, summer is also about taking extra time for enjoying the beauty of all creation given to us by God. It is about doing some things we can't do during winter, especially here in Michigan! It

certainly should give us some extra time to think, reflect and pray as well. That is what I always hope for during summer days. Generally speaking, I think summer is a time for a bit of renewal, especially in our area of the land where we experience the four seasons. The extra recreation we can enjoy gives us the opportunity to clear the mind, see the beauty of God's creation, and sometimes just let the mind do nothing. Not surprisingly, it is most often during those times that our creativity is most active in our minds!

I will be taking that time to enjoy some of God's creation this week. For this week, and another later in the month, we will not have morning Mass here. This has not happened for a few years because Fr. Brian Meldrum was living here for the summer with his continued studies. Now that he has graduated and completed that phase of his life, he has been assigned this summer as the administrator of Cabrini parish in Allen Park while the pastor is on a sabbatical. Within our family, St. Joan of Arc does have a new priest on board, but Msgr. Bugarin is still limited in his capabilities of steps and walking, etc. Some people are under the belief that it is the job of priests to go around and say Mass whenever, even many times a day, and wherever. That is not the case. Priests are to say one Mass a day, two if pastorally necessary (e.g., a funeral), and only three with permission (e.g., Christmas, Easter). So, for this week, I encourage participation in Mass with our Family of Parishes or next door at St. Paul.

A few weeks ago, I participated in the Missionary Renewal Assembly for the Archdiocese of Detroit. This was helpful for us priests, and other staff members, concerning the Family of Parishes. It gave us an opportunity to focus a bit more on our Family of Parishes (St. Joan of Arc, St. Lucy, St. Veronica, and St. Basil). ** Please keep in mind our Outdoor Rosary (weather permitting) at the Rosary Garden (on Morningside) at 7:00 pm to pray the rosary as a family. It is also an opportunity to invite other family members and neighbors, to join us! ** Next weekend, the Pallottine Fathers will be here as part of the Missionary Cooperative Plan within the Archdiocese of Detroit.

** Don't forget to say some prayers for an increase in priestly vocations this week! Enjoy the blessings of the Lord this week.







Saint of the Week



SAINT KATERI TEKAKWITHA (1656-1680)

July 14

Though the New York State Thruway runs close by the North American Martyrs' Shrine, traffic's roar never pierces the peace enveloping Auriesville—Ossernon to Native Americans—in the lovely Mohawk Valley, where Kateri Tekakwitha was born barely ten years after the martyrdom of Isaac Jogues and his Jesuit and lay companions. Daughter of a Christian Algonquin mother and non-Christian Mohawk chief, Kateri's parents died in a smallpox epidemic widely blamed on the missionaries. Moreover, many Native Americans had experienced exploitation at the hands of "Christian" traders and trappers, further discrediting the faith Kateri embraced in baptism, then pledged to live even more intensely in vowed virginity. Misunderstanding led to harassment, prompting her move to a Christian village farther north along the Saint Lawrence River. Despite this, Kateri's faith remained undaunted, her selfless charity undiminished. Both before and after her death at twenty-four, this young "Lily of the Mohawks" drew countless converts to Christ by the fragrance of her goodness. Through us, does "the aroma of Christ" (2 Corinthians 2:15), attract others to the beauty of his gospel?
