The Church strongly encourages people to receive the Sacrament (Anointing) of the Sick at the early stages of serious sickness or before serious surgeries.

In emergency situations needing the prompt attention of a priest, please call the parish office.

MARRIAGE

Archdiocesan law requires advance notice of at least six months.

PARISH REGISTRATION

Newcomers to the parish may register in the Parish Office during regular office hours.

Others, please notify the Parish Office of address changes.

Adults over 21 need to be registered as an individual member to be considered a Catholic in Good Standing.

Hearing devices are available for use during Mass. Please ask an usher for assistance.

Half and Half from Msgr. Gary Smetanka

As we approach this last half of Lent, we can hopefully take the opportunity to truly reflect upon our path of conversion and our need for reconciliation. As the elect (those who will be baptized at the Easter Vigil) experience their three scrutinies beginning this Sunday, we are all presented with a challenge: to see and experience God's presence and His great gift of love and all that is contrary to sin. The scrutinies, as provided in the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults, are meant to raise up and expose whatever keeps the transforming love of God from liberating all forms of oppression. They are meant to unmask the deception of evil and sin because they rob authentic and true life. The scrutinies help point and focus the elect (and all of us) toward freedom salvation and life. Hopefully, through the scrutinies we can see more clearly the gifts and attitudes that help to deepen our relationship with God. [The "scrutinizes," while directed to those about to be baptized in the Church, we can all benefit from such a scrutiny!]

When we think of our relationship with God, we might also think of the sins we commit that prevent that deeper relationship. As we go through life we might forget some of the things that are sins. Increasingly people seem to forget that the Church still teaches that we are to participate in Mass every Sunday, barring physical disability or sickness or another serious reason. We are not asked to go just once a month, twice a month or whenever it fits our schedule. (With the schedules many people keep today it might never fit in!) This should be a priority in our week so that we can be nourished by God's Word and strengthened by His Body and Blood in order to remain Christian in all we do and say throughout the week. Maybe we also forget that lying, stealing, cheating and swearing are also sins. So is the disrespect or unkind thoughts and actions that we show to all of God's creatures.

This is not the place to give a complete examination of conscience but I urge you to not only seriously think about the sins you have committed but most importantly think of the wonderful Grace you receive from God in the Sacraments, especially the Sacrament of Reconciliation, which gives us a chance to "wipe the slate clean" and be renewed by God's love.

**** Speaking of our sins... I will be in church this Tuesday from 1 - 2 pm, and again next Monday from 6:30 - 7:30 pm, for private individual confessions. This is an addition to the regular time of 3 pm Saturday, until all have been heard.**

**** Thanks to all of you who have participated in our Friday Fish Fry this lent. So far it has been wonderful! Many people have enjoyed our fine Friday Fish Fry fare for fast or feast! Our highest dinner night last lent was 370 dinners. I think we can set a new high in the next three weeks. Carry-out cod can complement curious culinary cravings, culminating in a content customer!**

**** Don't forget to plan on participating in our Holy Week services. More descriptions of these liturgies will be forthcoming. Why not also invite a friend or neighbor to come with you?**

May the Lord continue to bless you and guide you in your Lenten pilgrimage.
