Congratulations to those who are receiving Jesus for the first time this weekend! It is an exciting time for these young Catholics and their family. We have seen these young ones over the recent years come up at Holy Communion time with their parents, and other family members, with their arms crossed over their hearts not being able to receive Jesus. How often I have seen them

look at with that desire in their eyes, waiting for the day when they can receive what their parents come to receive Sunday after Sunday after Sunday. Today is their day! They have prepared for this day for some time. One significant step along the way took place last October when they participated in the Rite of Enrollment, signifying the start of a more intense preparation and study about Jesus in the Eucharist. Their parents have assisted them through their own participation in Sunday Eucharist every week. They have studied the parts of the Mass together. They have discussed what Jesus means to them. Now this day is finally here!

Those of us who have been receiving the Body and Blood of Jesus for many years know how much we need Jesus! Yes, we need Him every week as we go about our everyday life. God, in all His Wisdom, knows us, those He created. That is why He gave us the Ten Commandments as well as the teachings of the Church...He knows what we need and these commandments and teachings guide us for our good! I was thinking about the amount of people who were at Mass for Easter (and Christmas) but not the weeks that followed. I wondered if a great number of people think and believe that those are the <u>only days</u> (Christmas and Easter) they have to participate in Mass! Somehow over the years maybe that is what they heard from others or just arrived at that conclusion themselves. (Maybe I should ask them!) The Commandments and teachings of the Church have not changed...we are to participate in Mass <u>every</u> Sunday and holy day of obligation! Why? God knows we need to have that weekly instruction through the Word of God as well as the nourishment we need in the Body and Blood of Christ! It also does our heart good to thank God each week for His amazing action in our lives!

This Sunday we hear about the core of our faith in the gospel reading. "Remain in my love. If you keep my commandments, you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commandments and remain in his love. I have told you this so that my joy may be in you and your joy might be complete." We know true joy can not be found in the things of this life. The true deep joy we so desire in our life is in the Lord, and we are nourished with the Body of Christ at Mass to keep us connected and in union with the Lord of Life.

What does it mean to have a Mass "offered" for someone?

An individual may ask a priest to offer a Mass for several reasons: for example, in thanksgiving, for the intentions of another person (such as on a birthday), or, as is most common, for the repose of the soul of someone who has died.

It is worth noting, however, that the offering of the Mass for that intention does not depend on it being publicly voiced but on it being specified in the priest's personal prayers. Similarly, if a priest announces that "I am offering this Mass for [such and such an] intention" he does not thereby require the rest of the congregation to pray for that intention.

Mass Intentions - Please Note: Mass intentions may be arranged by coming into the parish office. According to Archdiocesan Policy, the suggested donation is \$10 per Mass per person. Masses can be for the deceased (+) and the living, so please don't assume that a Mass being said for a living person, means that they are ill, please respect the privacy of all individuals. Mass intentions *must be received 14 days prior to publication* to be published and read at Mass.

What is the procession route?

The procession will begin with the Exposition of the Blessed Sacrament at St Paul on the Lake Catholic Church. The faithful will proceed along Lake Shore Road and conclude with Benediction at Our Lady Star of the Sea Catholic Church.

Do I have to walk the whole way?

All are invited to the 12:00 noon Mass at Saint Paul on the Lake Catholic Church, after which we will start the procession.

Recognizing that not everyone may be able to walk the entire route, we have a few spots where participants can join the procession,

- Lake Shore and Moross
- Lake Shore and Woodland Shores
- Ballantyne and Cook Road

Approximate times when we will be at these intersections will be posted closer to the event.

Procession will end at Our Lady Star of the Sea with Benediction, followed by fellowship in the Pointe.

Will we process even if it rains?

Yes, we will. If it rains, the Eucharistic procession will continue as planned. Please bring and umbrella and or raincoat.

What is the Catholic Services Appeal?

The Catholic Services Appeal is an annual campaign that raises funds for the Archdiocese of Detroit ministries, programs, and services that benefit all the faithful in southeast Michigan. This archdiocesan-wide campaign communicates that the local Church extends beyond the parish.

The CSA is an opportunity for the faithful to respond to Christ's command "to love one another as I have loved you" (John 15:12) by helping to fund services throughout the broader area of southeast Michigan. This collaborative, archdiocesan campaign is a way to demonstrate the unity of the larger Church and to fund these vital programs.

What does the CSA fund?

The Catholic Services Appeal benefits parishes and people in the Archdiocese of Detroit by helping to fund more than 170 ministries, programs, and services, including: support for men discerning God's call to the priesthood at Sacred Heart Major Seminary; campus ministry; grants to Catholic schools; and young adult programs. Essentially, CSA dollars help fund the spiritual and corporal works of mercy in the greater Detroit area.

Who oversees and distributes CSA funds?

The archdiocesan lay Finance Council oversees the distribution of CSA funds to ensure they reach the ministries, programs, and services for which they are intended.

Have CSA funds ever been used to settle judgments against the archdiocese?

No CSA dollars have ever been – or ever will be – used to settle claims of any nature against the archdiocese.
