- 3. See if your student can put them in the correct order.
- 4. The stories we have been learning connect us from creation to the resurrection. Talk about the significance the stories point to. We have listed one main point below. You may come up with more.

Creation: God created us out of His Love

Noah: Being saved through water points to baptism

Joseph: Points to forgiveness and mercy

Moses: Points to trusting God even when we're afraid

The Ten Commandments: Shows how rules keep us safe and happy The Birth of Jesus: Points to God keeping His promise to send a savior

The Parable of the Sower: How we have to be open to being good soil for the Word of God

The Prodigal Son: Show's the father's merciful heart

Holy Week: Shows how God saves His people through Jesus' death and resurrection
